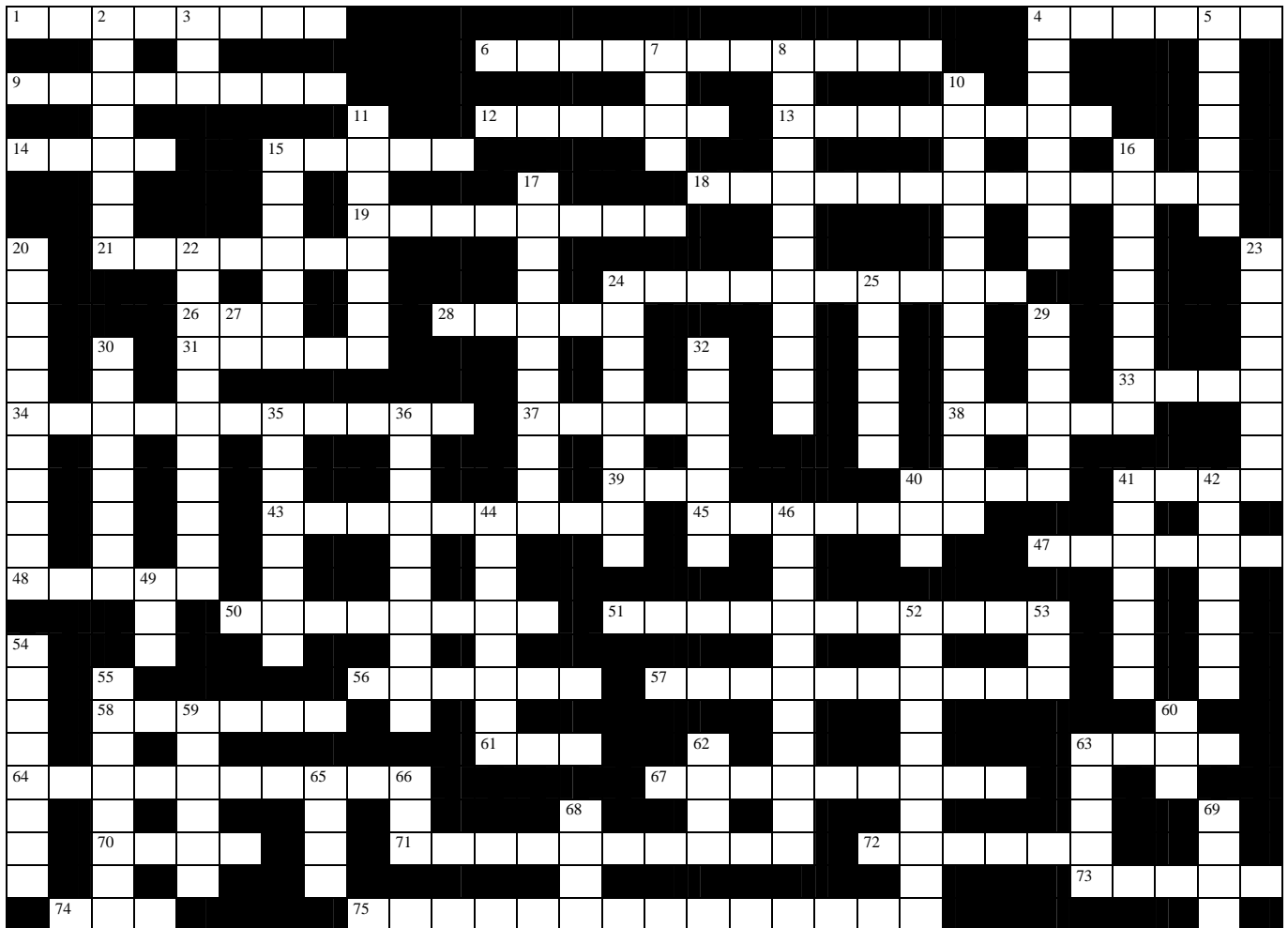


Word list
